As educational leaders, we strive to provide unique opportunities and experiences that enhance the academic and artistic development of our participants. It is our hope that the programs offered through SEI will continue to be part of the lifelong learning of our participating members.

There are three components of Summer Enrichment Institute:

Academic & Visual Arts Classes, Instrumental Music Lessons, and Theatre Skills & Productions

Academic & Visual Arts Classes offer opportunities that introduce, instill, and enhance Next Generation Skills (NYS Learning Standards), foster creativity, and provide hands-on experiences.

Instrumental Music Lessons offer opportunities, to beginners through high school students, in private instruction on instruments in orchestra and/or band.

Theatre Skills & Productions offer opportunities in dance, music, and theater that introduce, instill, and enhance performance skills. We also produce four musical theater productions (separate from classes) at the K-2, 3-5, Middle School, and High School levels.

- SEI also provides opportunities for college-level students to participate as interns in one of the musical theater productions. The internships enable students to have practical, hands-on experiences in the field of theater. **Interested parties should be currently studying music education, theater arts, or musical theatre in college. Students should apply via the SEI email; these positions fill quickly.**
- There are also opportunities for current high school students to work as assistants in the musical theatre programs. Students gain hands-on experiences and earn community service hours for their work. **Please send us an email if interested: seiregistration@pittsford.monroe.edu**

Registration and Communication:

- **Registration will begin March 25th at 8am and close on June 7th at 6pm.**
- Participants are accepted by the date of registration. Enrollment is capped for many of our courses.
 - In the event of a class reaching its cap, students will be put on a waitlist. Students will be added to the class if space and the instructor permits.

Course Information:

Confirmation and necessary information regarding specific courses (course and pick up/drop off locations, materials, etc.) will be sent prior to start of class by the course instructor. **Teachers often send this message the week before the course begins.**

Faculty:

The faculty members of SEI are qualified professionals with experience as performers and educators. The interns participating in the program are college students studying in various areas of education and the arts.

Attendance:

As a courtesy, we ask that you let the instructor know if your child is unable to attend class.

Transportation:

SEI does not provide transportation. For the safety of all, we ask that you drop off students at the designated areas and pick them up promptly at the end of each session.

SEI Policies

- 1) Participants are accepted according to the date of enrollment.
 - a. After completing the registration form on FamilyID, **you will receive a confirmation email from FamilyID Notifications with course information and pricing. This email serves as your invoice. No additional documentation will be sent.**
 - i. Please check your junk mail—the confirmation often goes there versus your inbox.
- 2) **Payment must be made within 72 hours of receiving your invoice.**
- 3) My School Bucks® or check are acceptable methods of payment.
 - a. Pay online through the Pittsford Payment Center by setting up a new My School Bucks® account or logging into your child's existing My School Bucks® account at www.MySchoolBucks.com, selecting the "School Store" tile, then "Summer Enrichment," and manually enter the total cost of your programs, as indicated on the FamilyID Notification email.
 - i. If you choose My School Bucks®, you will be charged the service fee associated with your district account. This fee cannot be refunded by SEI or PCSD.

- 5) SEI does not wave tuition.
 - a. Families needing tuition assistance should contact their building principal.
- 6) Prorating class costs for extenuating circumstances will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
- 7) SEI does not provide transportation to and from classes.

Registration/FamilyID Instructions

We are excited to offer the convenience of online registration through [FamilyID](#) from **March 25, 2024 – June 7, 2024**.  1. **If you have multiple children enrolling in our courses, please complete a SEPARATE registration for EACH child.**
2. Next click on the blue **Register Now** button and scroll, if necessary, to the **Create Account/Log In** blue buttons. If this is your first time using FamilyID, click **Create Account**. Click **Log In**, if you already have a FamilyID account.

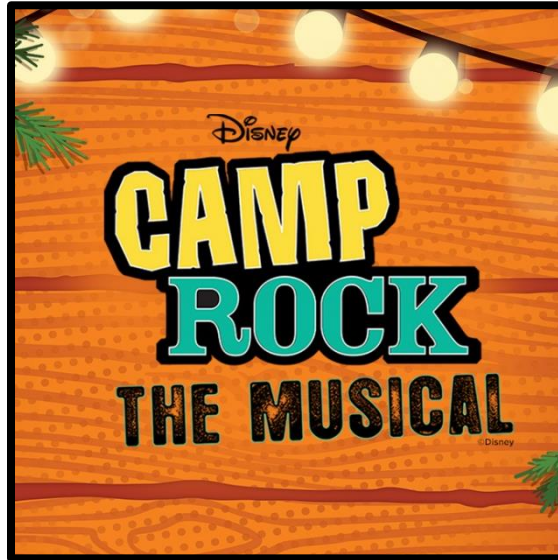
