#### PRINCIPAL'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Parents and School Community,



As a result of the unsuccessful super-majority vote on the 2017-18 proposed budget, a revote will take place on Tuesday, June 20, 2017. **Below is the schedule for the 2017-2018 proposed budget revote, as determined by New York State law:** 

Monday, June 5, 2017- Board of Education Meeting, 7 p.m. Barker Road Middle School Board Room (Meeting Room 1).

Monday, June 12, 2017- Board of Education Meeting/ Public Budget Hearing, 7 p.m. Barker Road Middle School Board Room (Meeting Room 1). Note: This meeting will be held in place of the June 19<sup>th</sup> Board of Education meeting.

<u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 13</u>, <u>2017</u>- Application for Absentee Ballots due.

<u>Tuesday, June 20, 2017</u>- Revote for 2017-2018 Proposed Budget, 7 a.m.-9 p.m. Barker Road Middle School Gymnasium



In the event this budget is not successful, PCSD will be legally required to go to a contingent budget which would result in a \$6.7 million gap from the last proposed budget. As we move forward, we encourage the PCSD community to attend the above Board of Education meetings and vote on June 20, 2017. As many families begin to think about summer vacation, please continue to encourage your child to keep reading. On the following page are a few strategies from a variety of sources that can help your child maintain and even improve reading over the summer months:

<u>Four or More for Summer Success</u> - Research shows that children who read at least four books during the summer are more likely to maintain and even improve valuable reading and comprehension skills. Take advantage of our local library and feel free to ask for help selecting books that match your child's age, interests and abilities.

<u>Allow for Your Child to Choose</u> - Nine out of ten children are more likely to finish a book when they choose it for themselves. You can add some excitement to the trip to the library or bookstore by having your child show you the books he or she is interested in reading.

<u>Take Reading Beyond the Book</u> - Ask your child questions about the story that he or she is reading. You can often find supplemental activities to enhance your child's enjoyment and comprehension by visiting a relevant museum exhibit, learning more about the author on the internet or by visiting the book's website.

**Keep Reading Aloud** - Reading aloud benefits all children, especially those who struggle. One benefit is that you can read books your child can't, so he or she will build listening comprehension skills with grade-level and above books. This will increase your child's knowledge and expand his or her experience with text, so that he or she will do better when reading independently. In addition to reading aloud with your child, you may also find that there are a number of books on CD. Having your child follow along in the book while listening to the story on CD, also provides a measurable benefit.

**Every Little Bit Helps** - Encourage your child to take advantage of every opportunity to read throughout the day. Even small opportunities like reading magazines, recipes or other printed material reinforce the importance of reading and can help improve a child's skills. *Remind your child to log the minutes for the Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge!*

During open house students were able to show their families how to make paper from paper pulp.













For Social Studies we are wrapping up the year by talking about the concepts of Government and Economy. Some of the big ideas are:




- How important documents of our country and others support the structure and function of that government and why they are important.
