Modi'in-Maccabim-Re'ut is a planned community established in 1993. It is located mid-way between Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. While staying with a host family in Re'ut, I was able to experience the day-to-day rhythm of Israeli life.



In order to learn about the educational system in Israel, I was able to visit a number of schools, including Kramim School, Psifas Special School for Education, Asif School and Amit School. During these visits, I was able to talk with and learn from students, teachers, principals, and parents. While there are obvious differences between the Israeli and American educational systems, there are also many similarities. First and foremost, children are children. The students I encountered had the same natural curiosity, sense of wonder and endless energy as the students in Pittsford. They were very excited to "show-off" their school and practice speaking English. Likewise, the teachers, principals and parents valued a strong partnership and shared the common goal of helping each child be successful as a learner and an individual. In addition, I was able to travel throughout Israel and spent time in Jerusalem, Nazareth, Capernaum, Bethlehem, the Golan Heights, Tel Aviv, Jaffa and the Dead Sea. It was a very surreal experience to stand in places I have only read about or seen in pictures.

Often, I am asked what my favorite part of the trip was. Apart from the natural beauty and rich history of Israel, it was the amazing people that made this trip so memorable. I met people from different cultures and faith traditions. Each with his or her own personal story and unique perspective. No matter where I went, the sense of welcome and genuine hospitality were unlike anything I could have imagined.

The well-known travel writer, Arthur Frommer once said, "At its best, travel should challenge our preconceptions and most cherished views, cause us to rethink our assumptions, shake us a bit, make us broader minded and more understanding." This trip did exactly that. As a result of my time in Israel, I have been enriched professionally and personally and sharing this experience with my wife and Shawn Beldue made it exponentially more special



I would like to thank the Jewish Federation of Greater Rochester and the Jewish Agency of Israel for sponsoring this trip to Israel. In addition, I would like to thank our Board of Education, Superintendent Pero and the TRE school community for supporting this trip and our participation in the Partnership2Gether Program. Toda!




Hello Thornell Road Families!

To celebrate at home your family can read poetry together!


