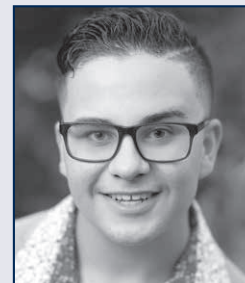
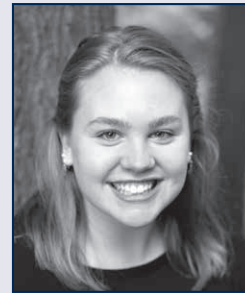

The award is sponsored by the Monroe County Council of School Superintendents and presented annually to an exceptional senior from each of the county's high schools based on character, service and scholarship.

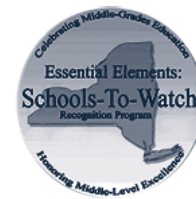

Barker Road and Calkins Road Middle Schools Named "Schools to Watch"

Barker Road and Calkins Road Middle Schools were named 2021 *Essential Elements: Schools to Watch* for the fifth consecutive time by the New York State Education Department, in partnership with the New York State Middle School Association and the Statewide Network of Middle Level Liaisons. According to Regents Chancellor Lester Young, the recognition is awarded to exemplary schools that have "implemented strategies from diversity and inclusion initiatives to project-based learning so they can best serve their students."

The Essential Elements: Schools to Watch honor is awarded every three years and recognizes schools that demonstrate continuous improvement and excel in the four domains of academic excellence, developmental responsiveness, social equity, and organizational structure. The designation is awarded to exceptional middle-level schools that meet rigorous criteria, are on a path of continuous improvement and highlight characteristics of high performing middle grade schools.



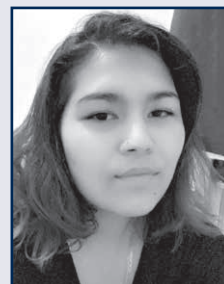
Mendon Class of 1984 Award Honors Urban-Suburban Seniors

The award was established in 2020/21 by the Pittsford Mendon Class of 1984. According to MHS Class of 1984 alums and award stewards Susan Hanscel Goodridge, Chip Walters, and Joy Tanner, the award will be granted annually to up to two graduating MHS seniors in the Urban Suburban Program based on their demonstrated civic, social, and leadership engagement or academic achievement.

The 84VIKINGS4GOOD Award is a needs-based, annual award, not to exceed \$12,500 per recipient which may be awarded each year

to two Pittsford Mendon High School Urban-Suburban seniors. "We are very proud of our Pittsford education and the foundation that it gave us to be the alumni that we are today. It is our hope that this award will help create a just and sustained society by leveling the playing field for these students," said Susan Hanscel Goodridge.



Pittsford's Barker Road Middle School Principal Named Director of Student Services



At a special meeting of the Pittsford Central School District Board of Education on Wednesday, May 12, 2021, Shana Cutaia was appointed Director of Student Services. Ms. Cutaia is the current principal of Barker Road Middle School and replaces the retiring Dr. Patricia Vaughan-Brogan. Cutaia officially begins her new role on July 1, 2021.

Cutaia has almost 20 years of educational experience. She began her teaching career in Pittsford as a middle school social studies teacher, went on to become the assistant principal at Brighton's Twelve Corners Middle School, and most recently is serving as the principal at Barker Road Middle School. "These positions have enabled Shana to utilize her keen collaboration skills, provide professional development at the building and District level, and support the instructional program at Barker Road Middle School," said Superintendent Michael Pero. "These skills and experiences will serve her well in her new role as Director of Student Services."

As Director of Student Services, Cutaia will be responsible for the nursing and counseling programs, health, safety and wellness initiatives including the management of COVID-19 reporting, and assisting with the diversity and equity programs.

Cutaia has a Bachelor's Degree in history from Nazareth College, a Master's Degree from St. John Fisher College, and a certificate in educational administration from SUNY Brockport. She also holds a certificate in Strategic Human Resources from Cornell University.

Mendon and Sutherland High Schools Ranked in Top 2% by U.S. News & World Report

Pittsford Mendon and Sutherland High Schools were among the top 2% of U.S. high schools in *U.S. News & World Report's 2021 Best High Schools Rankings*. Mendon and Sutherland High Schools

were ranked number one and two among Rochester area high schools, respectively.

U.S. News evaluated 17,857 public high schools across the U.S. and 1,218 in New York State. Schools were evaluated based on five ranking factors, including college readiness, college curriculum breadth, math and reading proficiency, math and reading performance, and graduation rates.

As County Program Supervisor for Monroe School Transportation since 2011, Grove has more than 20 years of experience in the transportation industry and has extensive experience in managing the daily operations of school bus transportation, including creating, scheduling and managing daily transportation routes; driver management, training and NYS compliance; scheduling; payroll; and quality control.

Prior to her role with Monroe School Transportation, Grove worked for the Churchville Chili Central School District as head bus driver from 2007-2011 where she oversaw human resource processes for transportation staff, managed NYS compliance and maintained on-time routes for the district.

"Ms. Grove comes to us with a wealth of knowledge and experience gained from a long career in school transportation services. We look forward to welcoming her to the District," said Pittsford Central School District Superintendent of Schools Michael Pero.

MHS and SHS Students Build Connections with Rochester Students through ROCKidsConnect

Mendon and Sutherland High School students participated in the ROCKidsCONNECT program this spring with students from Urban Choice Charter School (UCCS), a K-8 school in Rochester. This year marked the largest group of student participants since 2017 when ROCKidsCONNECT was established by the non-profit organization, Rochester Kids, whose goal is to make a difference in the lives of Rochester youth and support students' successes. Each student from UCCS was partnered with two students from MHS or SHS, and the

groups met virtually once per week to get to know each other, review academic assignments designed to prepare UCCS students for New York State assessments, and participate in group sessions and activities.

ROCKidsCONNECT aims to enrich the lives of city and suburban youth through a local student exchange program in which students meet and learn from each other through participation in academic projects and diversity activities that promote cultural awareness.

New Equity Policy Adopted

Ensures the Principle of Equity is Applied to Policies, Programs, Systems, Operations and Practices

Pittsford Central School District's Board of Education recently approved a highly comprehensive policy on the application of equity within and across the District. This newly adopted Equity Policy is designed to ensure that all students are able to learn at their highest ability with a sense of belonging at their school. The policy was developed over the course of two school years and included the involvement of dozens of people from many various committees and a wide range of stakeholders.

The Equity Ad Hoc Committee that developed the policy worked persistently to learn and process information from personal lived-experiences, literature, and other school districts on this same journey. The committee was also intent on bringing the student voice to the policy. "The student committee members were passionate about this work and made numerous contributions to the concepts and language of the policy," said Superintendent Pero. "The breadth of work to develop this policy was broad and deep, and I would like to thank each of those involved for their thoughtful contributions," he added.

The District will be working this summer with Tasha Potter, BOCES Director of Diversity and Equity Planning, to assist with the process for developing its Equity Action Plan – including how to identify multiple and diverse stakeholders – as well the action items, timelines and contents of the plan. While this is underway, PCSD is continuing to analyze how the use of Federal funds may be able to support this work.

In her consultant role with the District, Potter will also provide recommendations to PCSD in its continued work around diversity, inclusivity and equity by:

- Reviewing and evaluating the District's beliefs, programs, policies and procedures in order to become more culturally responsive.

- Assisting in the development of equitable programs, policies and procedures to build a more welcoming and inclusive culture.
- Assisting in evaluating, selecting and developing curricular materials that support all learners.
- Helping to analyze data sets relating to hiring, student achievement rates, suspension rates and course enrollment to identify strengths and areas of improvement.
- Helping to plan learning opportunities for educators related to diversity, equity and inclusion.
- Consulting in the development of structures and programs of recruitment, hiring, mentoring and retention of diverse faculty and staff.

"I look forward to supporting Pittsford and other local schools as they identify areas of inequities and work to remove and replace inequities with equitable school experiences and outcomes," said Potter. "Collaboratively, we will work to create partnerships that lead to access and opportunity for all students."

Potter previously led numerous equity initiatives at Greece Central School District in her roles as Director for Equity & Family and Community Engagement, Principal on Special Assignment for Equity and Family Engagement, and Lead Principal of Equity. She earned a master's degree, bachelor's degree, and Certificate of Advanced Study in Educational Administration from SUNY Brockport, and is currently working to complete her doctorate in executive leadership at St. John Fisher College.

Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten Screening is mandated by New York State and assesses children in the areas of motor skills, concepts such as counting/object naming skills, and language skills.

Legislation Regarding Religious Exemptions for Vaccines

New York State legislation (Public Health Law 2164) has eliminated religious, non-medical exemptions from school vaccination requirements, effective June 13, 2019. The revised law specifies that children in a public, private or parochial school, without a medical exemption, must receive the required immunizations to attend or remain in school. The District will be required to exclude a child from school if these provisions are not in place.

NYSED Notice on Health Examinations

Per New York State Department of Education:

- Effective May 11, 2021 students who are unable to obtain a health examination in the required grade have until September 1, 2021 to obtain the required health examination.
- Parents/guardians are encouraged to have their children's physicals completed and returned to school by September 1, 2021.
- Medical directors may choose to postpone completing health examinations until after December 31, 2021 for students who do not provide a health certificate for the 2021-2022 school year.

Frederick Douglass's Great-great-great Grandson Meets with Students

With only two known images of Anna Murray Douglass, FDI asked Rochester area students to submit artwork depicting how she may have looked at different stages of her life as part of the Centennial celebration of the 19th Amendment.

Pittsford students, staff and the guests of honor were joined virtually by PCSD Superintendent Michael Pero and former Village Mayor/Sutherland High School alumnus Bob Corby who offered their congratulations to Mendon High School students Holy Kim and Mina Stevens who won 1st and 3rd place, respectively, and to all the Pittsford students who created artwork to honor the legacy of Anna Murray Douglass.

Holy Kim's award-winning painting depicts a scene of Anna Murray Douglass as she brings people escaping slavery into her home, while Mina Stevens' painting shows Anna Murray Douglass as the North Star—a symbol of freedom and hope for slaves.
