
WELCOME TO CALKINS ROAD MIDDLE SCHOOL

Riding the bus

If a student wants to ride another student's bus, a note must be brought to the Main Office in the morning to be verified.

Late Bus

If a student is staying after school, they can take the 3:30p late bus shuttle to SHS to then get their bus home. All students taking the late bus need a pass from the adult they were staying with.

Enrichment

Enrichment is an additional period each day that the students are in a team core class. This rotates through the subject areas. This period is used for extension activities, labs, reteaching and team building exercises.


Homework

Homework is posted every day on the CRMS website by 3:30pm. Please check this site for information before requesting work.

Attendance Line

If your child is going to miss school for any reason, please call 267-1909. If a child is out for two consecutive days or more, homework requests can be left on the Attendance Line. Homework can be picked up after 3:30p. Please see CRMS website for policy about requesting work for vacations.





IT BLUE TEAM

Some examples may include \$\epsilon\$; Attending THREE events outside of school that you are not directly involved in \$\epsilon\$; Walking in the CRMS/SHS Homecoming Parade \$\epsilon\$; Joining and being an active participant in a school club (attend at least 3 meetings/events)

Signing in/out of school

If a student arrives late to school, a parent must come into the Main Office to sign in. The same procedure is in place for picking up early (even if a note is sent in the morning)

Cell Phone Policy

Students are allowed to have a cell phone at CRMS. The cell phone is not to be used during the day AT ALL. The exception is if during a learning activity under the direction of a teacher.

Parent Loop

When picking up or dropping off your student before or after school, please be sure to follow the signs for the parent loop. Cutting through the parking lot can create dangerous situations.

Intramurals after school

The sports rotate during the year. Students do not need to sign up for intramurals in advance. Students take the late bus or get picked up at 3:30p.



Some options for students getting extra help

Library- Students may choose to stay at the school library after school to complete work independently.











Meeting the Counselors
