

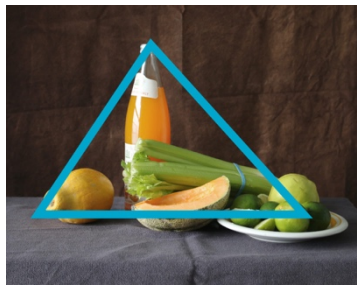

OVERVIEW

Drawing and Painting 1 is a secondary Art course that has the pre-requisite of Studio Art. In Drawing and Painting 1, students will expand their knowledge on the ability to realistically render objects from observation, explore a variety of different drawing and paint media and explore their own personal style. The Painting and Drawing 1 course is centered and graded upon the four National Core Art Content Standards:

- Creating
- Presenting
- Responding
- Connecting

SUPPLIES

Students will receive a supply kit containing basic supplies they will use regularly during the course both at home and in school. In addition, they will be required to purchase the following supplies:

- Portfolio (at least 18"x24")
- Hard or spiral bound mixed media paper sketchbook minimum 60 pages (max size: 9"x12")
- #2 pencils
- Good eraser

GRADING

Evaluation will include research, analysis, and visual exploration, and production from thumbnails through to completion. Class attendance, participation, adherence to deadlines, improvement, striving toward excellence will all contribute to the final grade. Self-evaluation, peer evaluation, teacher evaluation, rubrics/critiques and original and digital portfolio reviews will be used as assessment tools.

Unit Projects

- .. Projects will be evaluated from thumbnails through completion.
- .. All phases of the planning and production process must be included for full credit.
- .. Rubric/reflection must be completed and turned in for full credit.
- .. Projects will be weighted according to the time dedicated to the project.

Sketchbook Assignments

- Sketchbook assignments will range from observational and imaginative drawings as well as web quests, project planning and written art analysis.

DEADLINES

Students will be given a due date at the start of each unit. The student will be given verbal checkpoints as the project progresses. The unit is expected in on the due date. Student's work will then drop one grade level per week late. At three weeks past due the project will only be accepted for half credit.

It is the student's responsibility to let me know if there are emergency situations when deadlines need to be extended.
