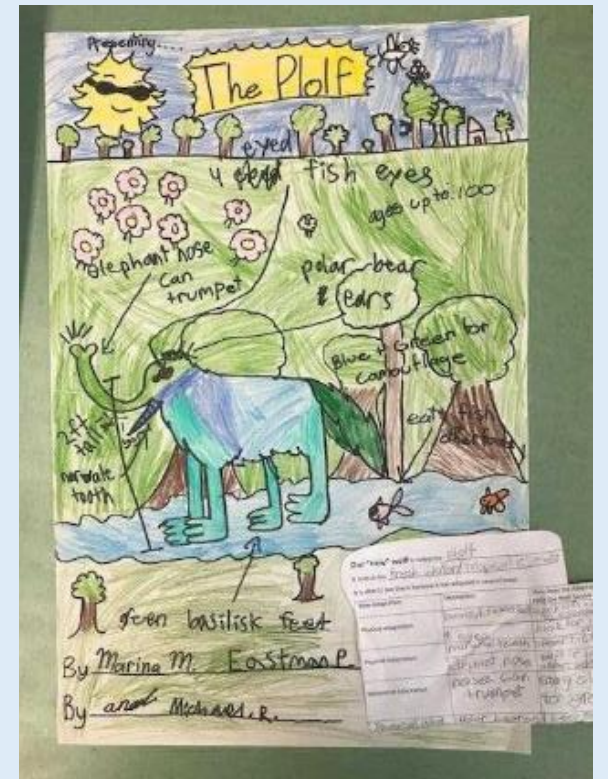
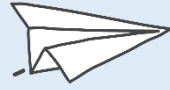
Urban, Suburban, and Rural Communities

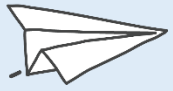


Pittsford Pride Award

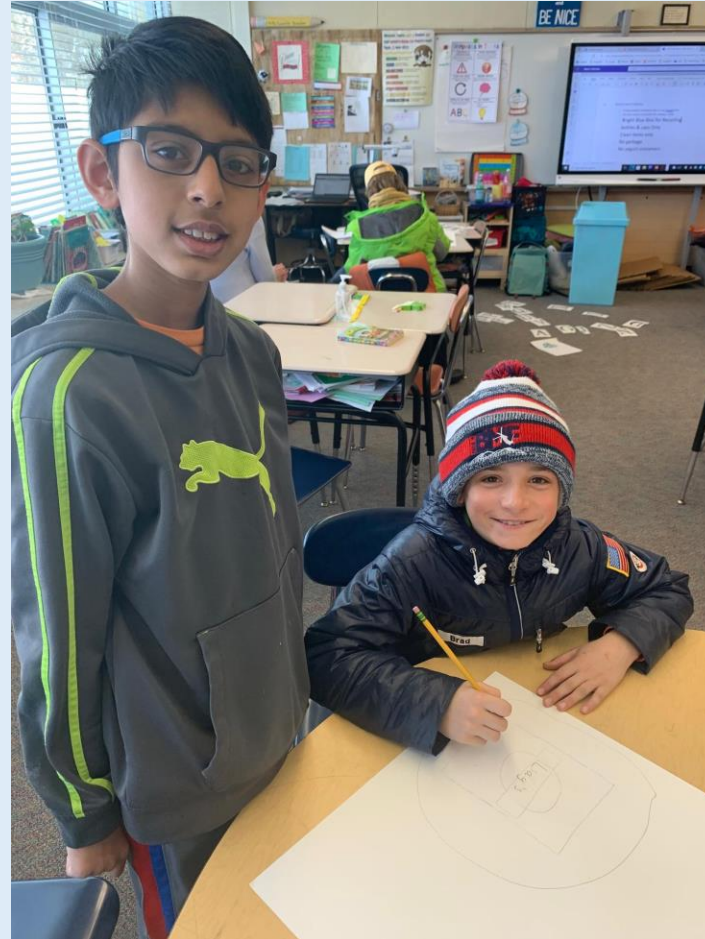
